BP 2200 BOARD DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Reference:

ACCJC Accreditation Standard IV

The Board of Trustees governs on behalf of the citizens of the Napa Valley Community College District in accordance with the authority granted and duties defined in Education Code Section 70902.

The Board of Trustees is committed to fulfilling its responsibilities to:

- Represent the public interest
- Establish policies that define the institutional mission and set prudent, ethical, and legal standards for college operations
- Hire and evaluate the Superintendent/President
- Delegate power and authority to the chief executive to effectively lead the District
- Assure fiscal health and stability
- Monitor institutional performance and educational quality
- Advocate and protect the District
- Prescribe and enforce by-laws and rules not inconsistent with law or regulations of the California Community College Board of Governors
- Approve annual and long-range plans and programs and oversee the administration of the college.
- Review and adopt the District's annual plan and budget and five-year facilities plan.

- Approves the appointment or dismissal of personnel as required by the Education Code upon recommendation of the Superintendent/President.
