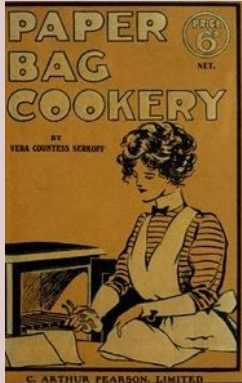

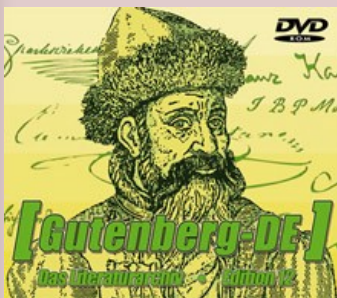

- ▶ Project Gutenberg offers over 40,000 free ebooks. In fact, their mission is to encourage the creation and distribution of ebooks. All of their ebooks were previously published by 'bonafide' publishers and then digitized and proofread with the help of thousands of volunteers. They describe themselves as powered by 'ideas, ideals and by idealism' and maintain that most of their ebooks currently exceed the standards of accuracy as recommended by the U.S. Library of Congress (defined as at the level of 99.95%).

- ▶ An especially nice feature of Project Gutenberg is the [Top 100 books downloaded](#) each day. It really gives you a feel for the scope of the collection, plus, it's just fun to see what folks are reading!
- ▶ [Sheet music archive](#) is another great resource currently available through Project Gutenberg and their partner, Classical Archives.com. For the most part, the musical pieces created have been chamber music, with composers such as Brahms and Beethoven.
