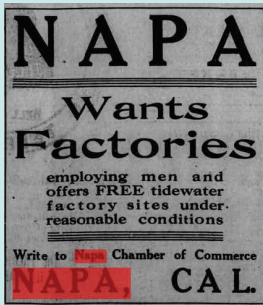

▶ [The California Digital Newspaper Collection](#) is an amazing online archive of significant historical California newspapers published from 1846-1922, including the first daily California newspaper, the *Daily Alta California* (San Francisco 1849-1891). The collection contains nearly 56,000 issues of various papers on over 400,000 pages. Additional classics include:

California Farmer & Journal of Useful Sciences (San Francisco 1855-1880)

California Star & Californian (San Francisco 1848)

Livermore Herald (Livermore 1877-1899)

Pacific Rural Press (San Francisco 1871-1922)

Placer Times (Sacramento 1849-1850)

Sacramento Daily Union (Sacramento 1855-1899)

San Francisco Call (San Francisco 1890-1913)

All newspapers published before January 1, 1923 are in the public domain and therefore have no restrictions on use. The archive also contains issues of several current California newspapers that are part of a pilot project to preserve and provide access to contemporary papers. THE CDNC is a project of the Center for Bibliographical Studies and Research (CBSR) at the University of California Riverside.

▶ [1906 San Francisco Earthquake and Fire Digital Collection](#) is presented by the Bancroft Library in collaboration with the California State Library, Stanford University Libraries, The Huntington Library, and various historical societies.
