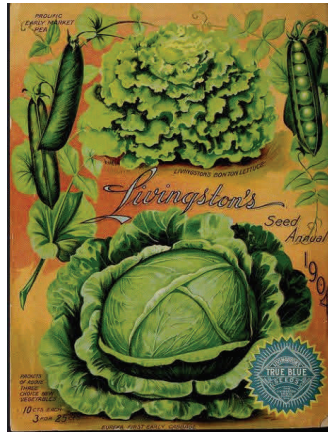

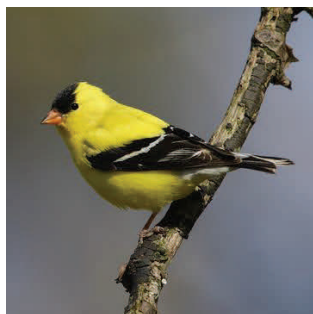
The Biodiversity Heritage Library also serves as the literature component of the Encyclopedia of Life.
