<u>HeinOnline</u>. For students of history and government, this database contains more historical content than any other. At your fingertips, you now have access to 300+ years of information on political development and the complete history of the creation of government and legal systems around the world. REDSHELF and **VITALSOURCE** - major textbook providers have opened up free access for students until the end of term. Refer to their websites for details -- check to see if your texts are available -- these are large providers of textbooks for classes.

Vital Source Access:

Visit <u>Vitalsource's Bookshelf login page</u> and follow the instructions to create an account. Students must create an account with their institutional (napavalley.edu) email address.

- 1. Once you confirm your email, you can sign in and search for books by title, ISBN, author.
- 2. When you find the title, just hover over it and click 'borrow'. **Users can borrow up to 7 titles.**

RedShelf Access:

Visit RedShelf's login page for <u>RedShelf Responds</u>. Students must create an account with their institutional (napavalley.edu) email address.

- 1. Once you confirm their email, you can sign in and search for books by title, ISBN, author through the borrow your text search box.
- 2. Once you find a title, click on details for the title you want and look for the ADD TO MY SHELF option. That will open a read now option and also put the book on your "shelf" to return to again.
